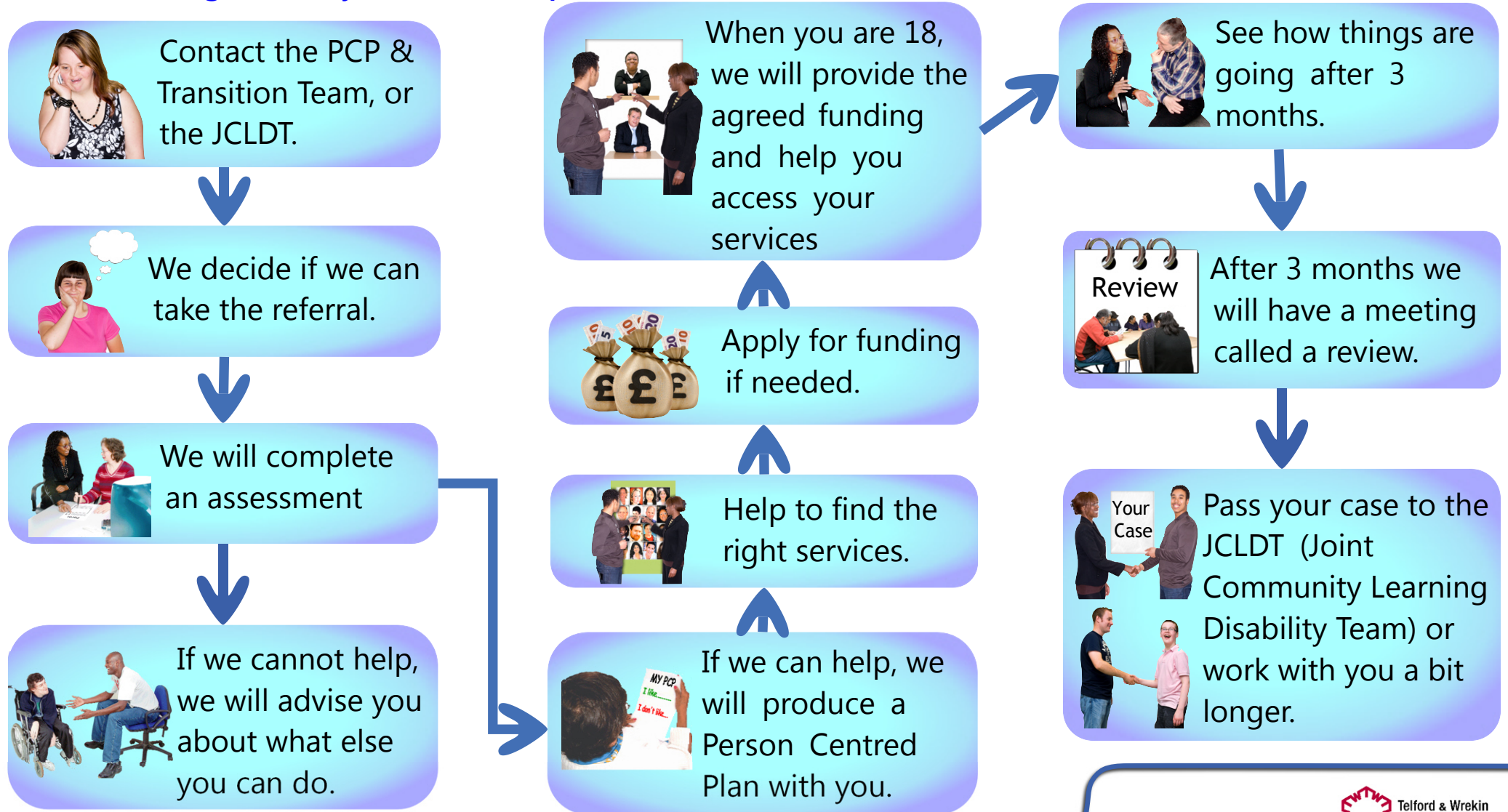


The role of the Person Centred Planning (PCP) and Transition Team

If you, or someone you know are under 17, have a learning disability and need help....

We will give you and your family all the advice, guidance and support that you need. This will help you to make an informed choice about what you want to do with your life.



The Person Centred Planning (PCP) and Transition Team



The PCP and Transition Team work with people from 14 years old upwards. In the team, there are 4 PCP and Transition co-ordinators and 1 Transition officer.

Usually, the people we work with have a learning disability. Sometimes we might work with people who have other needs.



From age 14 we will help with transition planning with the development of a person centred plan. The plan will tell professionals how to support individuals and their families with transition from school to adult life.



At age 16 a 'specialist social care assessment' will be completed to decide whether a person will need a future service. Person Centred Planning will help people who need services to find the right support to meet their needs and achieve their goals.



We also work with people who are already receiving a service from Adult Social care and can support them to develop a person centred plan.

Occasionally we might feel that we are not the best team to help someone and might refer a person on to another, more appropriate service. If this happens we might suggest other places for you to get future support.
